**RICHARD MANDELLA**  
Director & Vice-President

Named to the Oak Tree Racing Association Board of Directors in November, 2006 . . . Enshrined into Thoroughbred Racing's National Hall of Fame in 2001, Mandella becomes the first-ever trainer selected to serve on Oak Tree's prestigious Board of Directors . . . Will celebrate his 59th birthday on Nov. 5 and has been operating a public stable for 33 years . . . Attained Breeders' Cup immortality at Oak Tree in 2003, when he saddled the winners of four of the eight Breeders' Cup races that day. The feat is regarded by many as the sport's greatest single-day

training achievement . . . Also recorded the only one-two-three sweep in the history of the Santa Anita Handicap, with Siphon, Sandpit and Gentlemen in 1997 . . . Has won two Oak Tree training championships and ranks sixth all-time at Oak Tree with 178 wins. He is tied for third in career stakes wins with 42 . . . Has also distinguished himself by devoting considerable time and effort through service on various panels and boards dedicated to improving racing surfaces, medication, necropsy, and improvement of backstretch housing . . . Resides in Pasadena with wife Randi and daughter Andrea . . . Son Gary operates his own public stable.



**WARREN B. WILLIAMSON**  
Director & Vice-President

Elected to Oak Tree Racing Association Board of directors in August, 2007 . . . Introduced to the equine world at an early age through visits to the family's 4,200-acre ranch near Ramona . . . He became an owner in the late 1960s but his stable's orange and yellow silks gained national prominence through the success of Nashoba's Key (recently deceased) . . . Graduate of Claremont Men's College in 1951 . . . Served two years in the army before beginning career as a stockbroker . . . Joined the firm of Crowell Weedon & Co. in 1970 and became a General Partner in 1976 . . . Involved in executive capacities of numerous philanthropic organizations in the San Gabriel Valley . . . Resides in Pasadena with wife, Alyce.



**ROBERT W. ZAMARRIPA, SR.**  
Director & Vice-President

Elected to Oak Tree Racing Association Board of directors in August, 2007 . . . He is a native Angelino, now making his home in Monrovia . . . Part owner of multiple stake winner, Jungle Prince, third behind Bordonaro in the Grade I Ancient Title Stakes at Oak Tree in 2006 . . . Since the passing of his wife, the father of four has increased his racing interests . . . Following his graduation from Pasadena College in 1955 he began a career in the field of electrical wholesale distribution, which ultimately led to his purchase of Los Angeles Wholesale Electric in 1983 . . . A subsequent expansion into the San Diego area in 1986 prompted "Bob" to turn over the reins of the operation to his son Bob Jr. and the company became known as One Source Distributors.

## Directors Share a Common Bond

In addition to their membership on the Oak Tree Racing Association's Board of Directors, the directors share a common bond—each has been an owner and breeder. That involvement furnishes a valuable perspective to their service on the Oak Tree Board.

**Dr. Jack Robbins**, president, is a founding director of Oak Tree. He and wife Maggie have been involved in numerous owner partnerships. Among the horses they have raced have been such stakes winners as Strub Stakes champions Nostalgia's Star and Most Host plus Gilton Madero (1995 Cinema Handicap) and multi-stakes winner Honeys Gem. Other notable Thoroughbreds raced by Dr. and Mrs. Robbins have been Smasher, My Little Margie, Casseleria and Leslie's Deb.

Dr. Robbins earned his doctorate in veterinary medicine from the University of Pennsylvania in 1945 and began his practice at race tracks in California. In 1956, he established a training center, broodmare farm and clinical surgery center at Conejo Ranch in partnership with Ed Jans. He and Frank Bishop set up a similar operation at Laguna Seca in the early 1960s.

**Sherwood C. Chillingworth**, a former real estate developer, was named an Oak Tree director in 1989 and the association's executive vice-president in 1993, has been an owner of Thoroughbreds for over two decades. He entered the sport with a stable that bore the nom de course of Paniolo Ranch.

As an owner, Chillingworth has been involved with grade I stakes winners Swing Till Dawn (1983 Strub and Widener Stakes), Yashgan (1985 Oak Tree Invitational and 1986 San Gabriel Handicap), Forzando (1985 Metropolitan, Ft. Marcy and Sierra Madre Handicaps) and Valley Victory (1986 Coaching Club American Oaks).

Mr. Chillingworth is a past Steward of the Jockey Club, Secretary of the Board of the TRA, director of the TRPB and member of the Equibase Management Committee.

**Thomas R. Capehart** has been involved in numerous successful racing and breeding partnerships. One of Capehart's best horses, Score Twenty Four, won the 1982 Grade I San Antonio Stakes. In partnership with Chillingworth and others, Capehart was in the ownership group of Yashgan, winner of the Oak Tree Invitational in 1985 and San Gabriel Handicap in 1986. Forzando II won the 1985 Metropolitan Mile and Sierra Madre Handicap. Other stakes winners include Rocket Alert, Quick Messenger, Fittobried, and Rejoice. Capehart is a partner in Valley Creek Farm located in Valley Center.

**John H. Barr** has served on the Board

of Directors and as President of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association for over 10 years and joined the Board of Oak Tree in 1997. He has bred and raced innumerable California-bred horses including stakes winners Beverly Z, Waingarh and Bob's Lady. He purchased his first yearling in 1971. Barr's stable now exceeds 25 Thoroughbreds. He races under the nom de course of Oakcrest Stable.

**Dr. Rick Arthur** was raised on a small breeding ranch in Northern California. While an undergraduate at U.C. Davis, he owned his first race horse, Writer's Cramp, who won at Stockton.

While practicing veterinary medicine in Southern California, he has had other ventures in ownership and breeding of Thoroughbreds. He won the Chula Vista Handicap at Del Mar with Notably Different. Worth Trying was his first broodmare. Verduret won the Sierra Nevada Handicap at Santa Anita for Arthur and partners.

Dr. Arthur raced Cattle Creek in partnership with Dr. Robbins. Cattle Creek set records for a mile and a half on dirt and turf at Bay Meadows. He raced Joni U Bar, before retiring her to produce several good foals.

Rio Tejo, an injured mare purchased from Sheikh Mohammed, produced Guillermo, who won four of eight including the Real Good Deal Stakes at Del Mar for Arthur, and Rio Oro, winner of the San Miguel Stakes at Santa Anita.

**Richard Mandella** was born in Altadena and raised in Beaumont, California. He aspired to be a jockey as a young boy and worked for his late father Gene, who was a blacksmith. Mandella spent five years in various roles at Three Rings Ranch

in Beaumont and one year at a ranch owned by former Oak Tree training champion Farrell W. Jones. Mother Nature determined that Mandella would be too big to ride and he turned his sights to training, putting in an 18-month stint with V. J. (Lefty) Nickerson in New York and he worked briefly for a small stable from Texas.

Some 31 years after establishing his own public stable, Mandella, a member of the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame, is now regarded as one of the greatest trainers of all-time.

Beyond his phenomenal race-day achievements (four wins on Breeders' Cup day 2003, for example), Mandella is widely respected for his sense of duty and dedication to the betterment of the sport. Through the years, he has devoted considerable time and effort serving on various panels and boards dealing with racing surfaces, medication, necropsy, equine welfare and the improvement of backstretch housing.

Named as Director and Vice President in November, 2006, Mandella becomes the first trainer to ever be selected to serve on Oak Tree's prestigious Board of Directors.

**Warren Williamson** is well versed in the majesty of the Thoroughbred, as he often visited his family's 4,200 acre ranch near Ramona, California, as a child. Warren became an owner in the late 1960s and was catapulted to national prominence by his homebred Nashoba's Key in 2007, as her victory in the 2007 Gr. I Yellow Ribbon ran her record to a then perfect 7-7. Along with his wife Alyce, Williamson is active in a number of philanthropic endeavors. He graduated from Claremont Men's College in 1951, and after a two year stint in the U.S. Army, he enjoyed a distinguished career as a stockbroker. Mr. and Mrs. Williamson currently reside in Pasadena. Warren was elected to the Oak Tree Racing Association's Board of Directors in 2007.

**Robert Zamarripa** purchased his first horse in 1986. Bob races in the partnership of Burk, Sciarra, Zamarripa. Zamarripa and his partners have won numerous stakes, including the Gr. III Hollywood Turf Express, with their Jungle Prince, whom they purchased in Kentucky. An indefatigable USC Trojan athletic booster, Zamarripa graduated from Pasadena City College in 1955 and began a career in electrical wholesale distribution, resulting in his purchase of Los Angeles Wholesale Electric in 1983. Following the passing of his wife Phyllis, Zamarripa has devoted more of his time and efforts to racing and in August, 2007, he was appointed to the Oak Tree Racing Association Board of Directors. A father of four, "Bob" resides in nearby Monrovia.

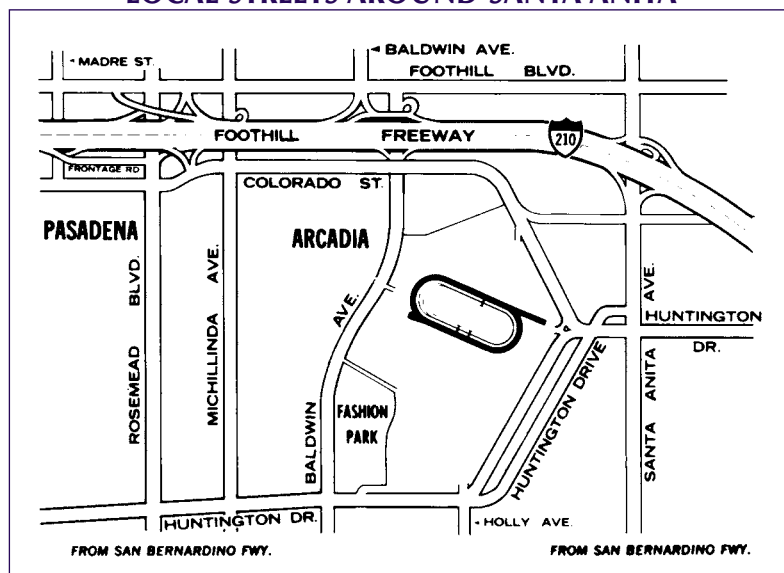
Here are some tips we hope will help you in making plans to visit Santa Anita Park, "The Great Race Place."

### *Locating Santa Anita Park*

Santa Anita Park is located in Arcadia, California, a residential community 14 miles northeast of downtown Los Angeles. The race track property is 320 acres bounded by Huntington Drive, Baldwin Avenue, Colorado Street, and Colorado Place. The Westfield Shoppingtown mall lies southwest of the race track.

Major freeways giving access to Santa Anita are the Foothill Freeway (I-210) on the north, San Bernardino Freeway (I-10) on the south, the San Gabriel River (I-605) and Orange (57) Freeways on the east, and the Pasadena (110) and Glendale (2) Freeways on the west.

### LOCAL STREETS AROUND SANTA ANITA



### *Directions from Area Airports*

#### **Los Angeles International Airport**

Santa Anita is 30 miles from Los Angeles International Airport. To reach Santa Anita from LAX, take the Century Freeway (105) east to the Harbor Freeway (110). Then take the Harbor Freeway north to Orange Grove in Pasadena. Turn left on Orange Grove and take it to the I-210 Freeway east. Exit at Baldwin and turn right.

#### **Hollywood-Burbank Airport**

Santa Anita is 21 miles from the Hollywood-Burbank Airport. To reach Santa Anita from the airport, take the Golden State Freeway (I-5) south to the 134 Freeway east. The 134 will become the I-210 Freeway east. Exit at Baldwin and turn right.

#### **Ontario Airport**

Santa Anita is 37 miles from Ontario Airport. To reach Santa Anita from the airport, take the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10) west to the 57 Freeway north to the I-210 Freeway west. Exit at Baldwin. Turn right on Foothill and right again on Baldwin.
